No talent or previous modeling experience is required to enter. Applicants must be between 18 and 28 years of age, never married nor having had a child and a resident of Michigan for at least six months.

Candidates for Miss Michigan USA will be judged on poise, personality, beauty and appearance.

Prizes, a trophy and round trip airfare to Jamaica for a seven night vacation along with a \$900 scholarship will be among awards for the winner. A guest appearance on Austin's Spring Fashionscope and a one year personal management contract are other prizes.
