The bride is assistant superintendent for instruction for the Northville Schools. The bridegroom is superintendent of the Plymouth-Canton Community Schools.



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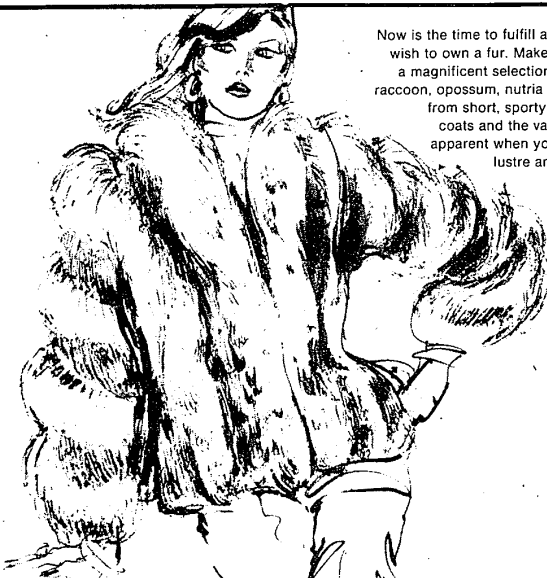
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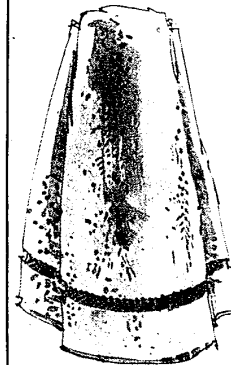
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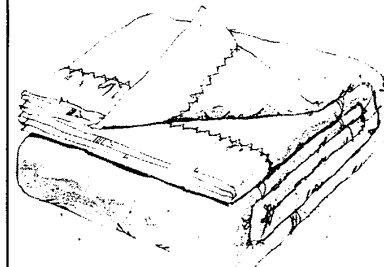
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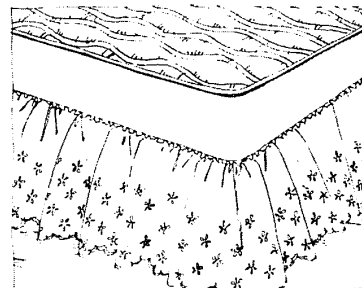
