Solar electric energy lecture in Ann Arbor

The Michigan Solar Energy Association will host a free lecture and demon-stration of new developments in solar electric energy (the conversion of sun-light to electricity) on Jan. 16.

The lecture, beginning at 7 p.m., will be held at the Ann Arbor Public Library, 343 S. Fifth Ave.

Methods for converting sunlight into usable electrical energy, through the use of photovoltaic cells, are being improved by independent companies and research teams across the country. This represents an effort to bring manufacturing costs and costs per kilowatthour down to a level competitive with conventional electricity sources.

Richard Komp, a solar electric researcher with Wayne State University, will be featured as guest speaker. Komp is completing study work on photovoltaics for a grant from the U.S. Department of Energy. He will show slides and actual solar equipment to demonstrate the feasibility of photovoltaics.

The MSEA holds regular bi-monthly meetings and lectures around the state.


