The watercolors, jewelry and sculp-ture on display at Little Gallery through January are all the work of one person, Doug Barthel. And as ex-pected, there's a pleasant relationship between Barthel's approach to all of these media.

"I'd like to do some big ones," he said, explaining how many of his pieces have the metal rolled out like a pie crust, then a section cut away and the edges rejoined, much as a dart in a jacket is engineered by a seamstress or

They have a lighting bolt upuility to them as the steel appears to be a moving line of unleashed energy. Barthel didhis undergraduate work in jerselry and metal at Wayne State University, studying with Philip Fike. He later taught at Wayne State, Wayne County Community Collega and in ML. Clemens. But it is the studio work which he likes and plans to continue to pursue in spite of the inevitable uncer-tainties which go with it.
