Governor vetoes 'closed' meetings

The Michigan Legislature has no chance to override Gov. William G. Milliken's veto of two bills giving local governmental boards more authority to

governmental boards more autuoring to hold closed meetings. Milliken last week rejected the amendments to the Open Meetings Act of 1977 as being "an unnecessary step backward."

Both houses of the legislature passed the bills in the closing days of 1980. Be-cause that legislature adjourned, there is no chance for a vote to override the veto, and the bills would have to be re-introduced from scratch.

SB 1143 would have allowed govern-tental boards to interview candidates for employment and appointment to public office in closed session. It was introduced by Sen. Richard Allen, R-
