Polish Studies Thriving

Robert C. Geryk, director of the Orchard Lake Schools' Center for Polish Studies and Culture, says it's "amazing how many books have been published recently in the area of Polish studies."

His comment was made in answer to a recent newspaper article stating that only a few books, especially of Polish literature, are in existence in the English language.

Geryk noted that the opposite has occurred in the past few years and that the Orchard Lake Center has compiled a selected bibliography of recently-published books, since 1960, devoted to the many as-

pects of Polish studies and culture.

"Though one might expect a greater number of translations, at least 45 new titles have been printed regarding Polish literature alone in recent years, with the prospect of many more in sight," Geryk said.

He added, "Three new textbooks of the Polish language have been produced. The appearance on the world scene of such outstanding individuals as composer/musician Penderewski and theatre director Grotowski, has meant many articles and books."

"In addition, 10 monographs and albums related to Polish art have appeared. I might add that the American Federation of Art in New York, has collected an exhibition of contemporary Polish artists and is touring the exhibit in the United States."

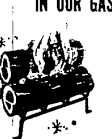

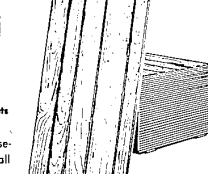

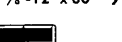
