Optimize deductions

The types of taxes which you may deduct on your tax return are real estate, personal property, sales and state and local income taxes paid during the year.

Amounts withheld from your paycheck for state and local income taxes are deductible in the year withheld.

Perhaps a majority of taxpayers understate their sales tax deduction. This could happen if you use the IRS tables accompanying Form 1040.

To be sure that you are not among that majority, determine your sales tax deduction using the tables. Then go through your checking records for all checks written for taxable items. Examples are department store and bank credit card purchases.

Also record the amount of most grawn as eash for out-of-pocket expenditures. Estimate the percentage of such cash you spent on taxable purchases. The total of these amounts will be your taxable purchases, including sales tax.

Assuming this total is \$15,750 and assuming a five percent sales tax rate, compute the deductible sales tax as follows: total including tax (\$15,750) less actual purchases of \$15,000 (\$15,750 minus 1.05) equals \$750.

(\$13,700) less actual purchases of your may be \$750.

When you compare the actual amount with the table amount, you may be surprised. Remember, either method is accepted by the IRS for computing your sales tax deduction.

Note that sales tax on your major purchases — such as automobiles, boats and jewelry — is best itemized seperately.

Lamalie, president of the executive search consultant firm, said.
"This dramatic action with increasing frequency includes firing or shelving the chief executive officer or chief operating officer and brining in a hard-hitting executive who can evaluate existing operations and people more objectively and dispassionately than one who has grown up in the company," he added.

THIS ACTION was reflected by a 15 percent increase in executive search assignments paying more than \$100,000.

As expected in a crisis environment,

general management positions at the chief executive, CEO, group vice presi-dent and other general management level positions continued to increase in

level positions continue to microscope.

Nearly three-fourths of all search assignments undertaken by Lamalie Associates in the last quarter of 1980 were between 555,000 and \$550,000 and confirming that the action taking place is at the top of the corporate pyramid.

The demand for top financial executives increased six percent while most other functional areas increased correspondingly.
