

IT'S TAX TIME again and members of the Farmington Hills Chapter of the American Association of Retired Persons who have had special training from the IRS will be at the Gathering Place at Mercy Center, 11 Mile, east of Middlebelt, on each Tuesday in February and March, plus Tuesday, April 7.

They'll offer assistance with the preparation of the 1980 federal, state homestead and energy credit forms for senior citizens.

The volunteers request those seeking help bring 1980 "W" and 1089 forms, amount of interest, dividends and social security received in 1979 and the amount of real estate taxes or rent paid in 1980 and to whom. A copy of your 1979 tax return is helpful.

All assistance offered remains confidential and free.

KUDOS TO BONAVENTURE Skating Center skaters who sweated out a six-hour skate-a-thon late last month to raise money for the American Diabetes Association.

The \$12,484.43 collected was the most money raised of any of the 12 skating rinks in southeastern Michigan participating in the annual "Skate to Beat Diabetes" event sponsored to fight the disease.

A total of \$81,834.41 was raised for on-going research and programs and the support of a summer camp for young diabetics.
