

Theologian storyteller to visit Sorrows church

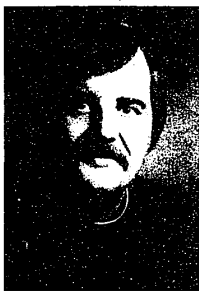
The Rev. John Shea, author, theologian, teacher and storyteller will speak at Our Lady of Sorrows in Farmington at 3 p.m. Feb. 8.

Shea teaches systematic theology at St. Mary of the Lake Seminary in Mundelein, Ill., and is director of the Doctor of Ministry program for the Archdiocese of Chicago.

Among the books he has published are "What a Modern Catholic Believes About Sin," "What a Modern Catholic Believes About Heaven and Hell," and "The God Who Fell From Heaven."

Shea gives frequent workshops and retreats, but he is, perhaps, most recognized for his gift of storytelling and his belief in the importance and effectiveness of storytelling in ministry.
