Judy Antishin leads a morning called "Easy and Elegant Hors D'oeuvres" at 9:30 a.m. Feb. 19 in Farmington Community Center.

"If your entertaining is often a spur-of-the-moment affair, some of my ideas will get you out of the kitchen and back to your guests where you belong," Mrs. Antishin said.

She will prepare each hors d'oeuvre with a running commentary of how it is put together, then offer the guests samples.

Her concoctions are all converted from a complicated gourmet recipe. "They are all new renditions, very simply made with economy in mind, and they can all be frozen," she said.

Her commentary will take the guests through an entire buffet, offering tips on what the well-prepared host or hostess should always have on hand — from the matching candles and tablecloths to the nuts and candy.

"I'll go over the entire grocery list and the steps I take to prepare a spontaneous buffet," she said.

GUESTS WILL learn new ways to prepare Italian-style marinated chicken wings, meat balls with a down South tang, puff pastry filled with sausage and her own celery-seed dressing suggested for fruit salad.

Judy's Surprise Punch will be one of the recipes offered. "With only the simple addition of alcohol it can be offered for an adult party. Otherwise it's suitable for the entire family," she said.

Mrs. Antishin has worked alone or in partnership with Barbara Dermody in the center for many years, demonstrating and sharing their culinary skills.

Most recently the two headed up the center's "Lunch With Us" series.

They will team up again on April 10 with a session called "Easter Brunch" with suggestions for planning the holiday meal.

The \$5 charge for "Easy and Elegant Hors D'oeuvres" includes printed recipes for guests to take home.

Reservations for all cooking demon-

strations offered in the center must be received five days prior to the event in order to assure all participants of an adequate sampling.
