"A Military Leader of the Battle of Yorktown" has been chosen by the Daughters of the American Revolution as the theme for this year's American History Month Essay Contest.

This decisive battle of the American Revolution had many participants from around the world. One famous leader was Baron Frederick von Steuben. He was a Prussian, a former captain in the army of Frederick the Great. Von Steuben had come to America to lend his services and fought along with Lafayette in Virginia prior to the Battle of Yorktown.

At the end of the war, the United States owed Steuben \$8,500 in cash. He was paid only \$1,700 and the remaining money came to him in the form of a treasury certificate, almost worthless in post-war America.


