

Tom Wilson, former C'ville trustee dies

Services were held Tuesday in Farmington for Tom Wilson, 75, who served 20 years on the Clarenceville board of education.

A friend noted that Wilson, would have "hated the weather" but also would have been pleased by the warmth of friends who ventured out in a snow storm to pay their last respects.

Wilson died at his Port Lucy, Fla., home after suffering a stroke on Jan. 31. He and his wife, Jean, moved to Florida 10 years ago after he retired from Hydromation Corp. in Livonia.

He was a member of the Clarenceville Board of Education during two separate periods — 1948-1951 and 1960-1977. The district includes parts

of Farmington, Livonia and Redford Township.

Wilson's longtime friend and board colleague, Dr. Samuel Prisk said:

"I was privileged to serve on the Clarenceville Board of Education for several years with Tom.

"He was a generous person, not wealthy and able to give material things, but he gave generously of himself, his time and his service.

"He was a kind and loving person and he especially loved young people.

"Tom was involved in programs for senior citizens, especially at Schoolcraft College, which honored him for his involvement. He seemed to be un-
tiring, carrying on years after others

would have cited age as a reason for quitting.

"It was his honesty that made him finally reluctantly retire from the activity he loved because of failing health and the admission that he couldn't really keep up.

"This entire community was blessed because we were allowed to share Tom with his wife and children. He was loved, he is missed and he will be long remembered," Prisk concluded.

Services at the Thayer-Rock Funeral Home were followed by cremation at Evergreen Crematory. In addition to his wife, Mr. Wilson is survived by three daughters, a son and seven grandchildren.
