Hospital pioneers laser-ear surgery

Southfield's Providence Hospital has become one of only seven hospitals in the world pioneering the use of an argon laser in ear surgery.

The argon microsurgical laser was made possible by a \$25,000 gift from the Meyer and Anna Prentiss Family Foundation Inc., in honor of noted otologist T. Manfred McGee, M.D., a staff physician at Providence.

According to Beverly P. Straus and Jewell P. Morris, president and vice president respectively of Prentiss Foundation, the gift was made to further the work of McGee and the Providence otology department.

"Lasers have long been used in eye surgery, but adaptation to ear surgery

is quite new," explains McGee, one of very few physicians to employ the procedure known as the small fenestra stapedectomy for the treatment of otosclerosis.

"The laser allows greater precision which results in less trauma and fewer post-operative side effects."

In addition, Dr. McGee reports that early indications are that the level of the restored hearing will be even better than that achieved by the regular small fenestra stapedectomy.

The laser is attached to a high-powered microscope. The surgeon uses the laser beam to make a very tiny hole in the footplate of the stapes. Into the precise opening, the surgeon inserts

a prosthesis which establishes continuity between the ossicular chain and the inner ear to restore hearing.

McGee, developer of the prosthetic device known as the McGee piston, said the microsurgical laser is a great step beyond even the small fenestra operation.

The traditional stapedectomy, still the most commonly used procedure, involves removal of the entire footplate,

which can result in trauma to the inner ear.

McGee, who received special training and certification in the physics and use of lasers, feels that it will become a commonplace tool in microsurgery of all kinds.

Besides Providence, the argon microsurgical laser is in use at four other U.S. hospitals and one each in Great Britain and Sweden.

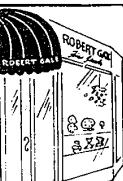
