# Murder suspect faces another charge

A Farmington Hills man may face second charge of murder in connec-

A Farmington Hills man may face a second charge of murder in connection with the stabbing death of 45-year-old Livonia woman in her home the morning of Feb. 8.

After some six hours of testimony in a Tuesday preliminary examination, 16th District Court Judge James Mies ruled that the prosecution may amend its complaint and seek an addidated the profession of a felony against Wade Gregg, 22.
Mies also ordered Gregg examined at a state forensic center to determine if he is completent to stand trial.

The examination will continue March 10.

Gregg has been charged previously with first degree murder in the slaying of Juanita Waluzak, the attempted rape of one of her daughters and the stabbing of a second daughter's

ed rape of one of her daughters and the stabbing of a second daughter's boyfriend. Described by an acquaintance as a community college student and an unemployed auto worker, Gregg allegedly tried to rape one of Mrs. Waluzak's daughters and stabbed another daughter's boyfriend in the same spree.

Gregg is also charged with first degree criminal sexual conduct and two counts of assault with intent to commit murder. He is being held without bond in Wayne County Jail.

Evidence of premediation, or forethought must be proveder conder. To convict a defendant of felony murder, the prosecution must only prove that a felony crime was being committed when the victim died.

James Lawson objected to the felony murder charge inclusion. David Lawson told Mies he might have cross-examined prosecution wit-nesses differently had a charge of murder during a felony been filed be-fore the examination began.

AT TUESDAY'S hearing Assistant Medical Examiner James Barnhill testified that Mrs. Waluzak suffered both strangulation and two stab wounds, any one of which would have been fatal. Determining the exact cause of death is impossible, Barnhill testified

He said she was stabbed 12 times in the neck, with two wounds piercing major arteries.

Barnhill said his autopsy of Mrs.
Waluzak found no evidence "one way or the other" of sexual relations or rape. He said the alcohol content of her blood at the time of autopsy was

21 percent.

The medical examiner said Mrs.
Waluzak's injuries included damage
to the face, perhaps caused by being
beaten beaten on the back of the head "with her face against a firm surface, such as a floor."

Testimony disclosed that Mrs. Waluzak's partially clothed body was found on a living room couch.

Sandra Ann Waluzak, Mrs. Waluzak's 20-year-old daughter, testified that her mother introduced her to Gregg about 3 a.m.

The next time she saw Gregg, she testified, "I was asleep and I opened up my eyes and he was right on top of me. He said that he was going to get me and he was swaring and then he threw me on the floor.

"HE STARTED beating me on the face and the chest and hitting me all over and then I started screaming for my sister," she testified.

Testimony indicated the sister, Chris Tina was asleep in an adjoining bedroom when Sandra Ann's cries woke her. She came into the bedroom and attempted to intervene.

"Tran out of the room into my ma's room and my sister ran into her room and my sister ran into her room and I locked the door and I tried to get out" through a window, but "I couldn't get it open," she said.

Sandra testified she managed to get away from Gregg and flee the house

to seek assistance from a neighbor who called police. Bandaged across the nose from a cosmetic operation initially scheduled the day of the al-leged incident, Ms. Waluzak wept in-termittently throughout her testimo-ny.

CHRIS TINA Waluzak said that after she was knocked to the floor by
Gregg she went back to her bedroom
and woke her boyfriend, Craig
Schmidt, 22. She said Schmidt was
dressing when Gregg entered the bed-

Schmidt, 22. She said Schmidt was resisting when Gregg entered the bedroom. Schmidt and Gregg were high school classmates, and Ms. Waltuzak testlified that after the two looked at each other. Schmidt said, "Wade. "That's when to Greg well bed him. (Schmidt) fell down to the floor. He just said 'Dear God."

Schmidt, stabbed in the abdomen, remains hospitalized although he is expected to recover. Chris Tina said that after Schmidt was stabbed, "I pushed (Gregg) out of the room. I heard him remark: 'I'm not a bad guy,'' she testified. Chris Tina said she barricaded the door with a bed and tried to open a window when she saw Gregg running down the street. She said she decided to leave by the front door, and while doing so found her mother's body sprawled on a sofamor was a soft of the said o

Ms. Waluzak testified she knew her mother was dead.
She said she then drove Schmidt to Sotsford Hospital for aid.
Various police officers testified to their respective roles in arresting Gregg, who was found on foot about a mile from the scene, and in process-ing evidence.
