THE DOUBLE EAGLE restaurant at Sylvan Glen in Troy has started a Sunday brunch, which features more than the usual brunch fare. On a recent Sunday, award-winning chef Kevin Enright included such dishes as veal with raisin and chutney sauce, and chicken teriyaki.

The dishes vary each week, but one of the specialties is Chicken Brennan, New Orleans style, with chicken breasts sautéed in heavy cream. Another is fish, smoked or poached.

The menu also includes four types of fresh salads such as mixed greens and marinated vegetable salads. Blueberry muffins, American cornbread and American fries are some of the home-style offerings.

Of course, sausage, bacon and eggs, as well as eggs benedict, are on the brunch buffet. Dessert favorites are fresh strawberries with whipped cream, and rice pudding.

There's lots more, and brunch hours are 11:30 a.m. until 3 p.m. In winter weather, the main dining

room looks out on the golf course where cross-country skiers glide, and in warmer weather, diners may see golf games in progress.

To start out the Sunday brunch, a "minosa lady" goes from table to table, selling a minosa cocktail, which combines champagne and fresh-squeezed orange juice.

AT MERIWETHER'S in Southfield, it's time to celebrate with fresh asparagus and spring wine. Fresh asparagus stalks with tips are on the menu in 14 variations from soup to stir fry.

The Fresh Asparagus and Spring Wine Festival continues through March 17 at Meriwether's. Asparagus entrees are Imperial Asparagus Stir Fry, Filet of Sole Hollandaise with Fresh Asparagus, Steak and Asparagus Stir Fry and Fresh Asparagus Quiche.

Special lunches and dinners rotate daily and range from \$4.50-\$5.95 at lunch and \$6.50-\$7.50 at dinner. These meals include a green green salad and Meriwether's Teacup

Bread, fresh baked and served in a teacup.

The "spring wine" complementing the asparagus dishes is an Inglenook from the Napa Valley region of California. Prices are \$1.99 per glass, half and full carafes also are available.

Restaurant hours are 11 a.m. to midnight Monday-Thursday, 11 a.m. to 1 a.m. Friday-Saturday and 11 a.m. to 10 p.m. Sunday.

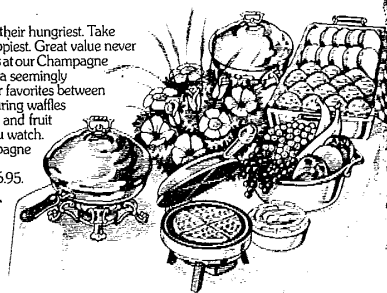
