CITY OF FARMINGTON COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS Summary

A Regular Meeting of the Farmington City Council was held February 16, 1981 in the Council Chambers, 23600 Liberty St., Farmington, Michigan. The meeting was called to order at 8:10 p.m. by Mayor William S. Hartssock.

PRESENT: Mayor Hartssock, Councilmen Bennett, Mitchell, Tupper and Yoder.

CITY OFFICIALS PRESENT: City Mgr. Deadman, Dir. Billing, Dir. Seifert, Attorney Kelly and Clerk Viane.

The minutes of the previous meeting were approved.

The minutes of other boards were received and/or filed.

The review of the non-conforming use at 22821 Orchard Lake Road was tabled for further interpretation of the ordinance.

Permission was granted to St. Gerald's Church to hold its annual Family A-Fair on May 15, 16 and 17, 1981.

Council accepted the low bid of Standby Power, Inc., Novi, Michigan, in the amount of \$11,700 for a 45 KW Natural Gas-generated Generator, and the low bid of Moloney & Co., West Bloomfield, Mich., in the amount of \$4,985.00 for installation of the generator.

The following resolutions were adopted:

- Establishing new rates for filling swimming pools and for providing construction water.
- Establishing new rates for water taps and establishing one inch as the minimum size taps provided by the city to its water system.
- Establishing a public hearing on April 6, 1981 at 8:00 p.m. to review proposed uses for Federal Revenue Sharing Funds.

The following financial reports were received and filed:

- Water & Sewer Funds, Quarter ended December 31, 1981
- 47th District Court, 7 months ended January 31, 1981

Councilman William S. Mitchell was appointed to the following committees as representative of the Council:

- Recreation Committee; Youth Assistance General Citizens Committee; Semco; Farmington Area Advisory Council; Review Committee for Deferred Special Assessment Payments; and the Farmington Area Industrial and Economic Development Commission.

Mr. Donald Munter, 3330 Oakland, was appointed to serve the unexpired term of Mr. James Abernethy, who has resigned, term to expire March 13, 1983.

The monthly bills were approved for payment.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:10 p.m.

The first North Oakland Activities Conference (NOAC) basketball race ended in a tie.

Auburn Heights Avondale forced the tie in the new four-team league by defeating Bloomfield Hills Cranbrook by five points Tuesday night. The Yellowjackets and Oxford each ended the league season with 5-1 records.

The co-championship didn't come easy, however.

The Yellowjackets were down 22-14 after the first quarter, and trailed the Granes 34-32 at halftime. Avondale outscored Cranbrook 38-31 in the second half.

"We hadn't played in a week, and it looked like we were in a daze during the first half," said Avondale coach Chuck Granger, whose team is now 10-8 overall. "I think we were looking ahead to the districts (that Avondale will host) next week."

SOPHOMORE TIM Morton led Avondale's second-half surge by scoring 15 of his 19 total points. "Morton was a big difference, he scored three straight baskets at one point and he took control in the second half," said Granger.

Avondale, which shot 31-61 from the floor (49 percent), made only eight of 18 free throws. Derek Woodmore was the game's leading scorer with 20 points, and he added 10 rebounds.

Cranbrook was led by Tim Hazen with 20 points and 11 rebounds. Rob Schurgin added 11 points for the Granes, and Adams Murphy and Dennis Leggs each had 10.
