Riverfront artist speaks at LIT

The works of Morris Jackson, an artist known nationally for his architectural renderings as well as his drawings and watercolors, will be presented in a special exhibit at Lawrence Institute of Technology March 12-April 3.

Jackson, a lecturer in the LIT School of Architecture, has worked with leading architects, bringing their preliminary plans to life with his sketches of the completed work.

It was his brush which gave the public its first views of much of Detroit's riverfront and municipal redevelopment, Northland and Eastland shopping centers, St. Louis' Gateway Arch as well as Washington's Dulles International Airport.

A native of Liverpool, England, Jackson began his professional career painting scenes from his summer visits to Maine.

Included in the more than 75 works on exhibit will be watercolors of scenes and buildings from Michigan and throughout the country as well as sketches and paintings of such architectural landmarks as the Lincoln Center Repertory Theater, Frank Lloyd Wright's "Falling Waters" residence, Dulles Airport, and the CBS Building in New York City. The exhibit will be held in the architecture gallery on the LIT

campus, 21900 West 10 Mile Road (near Northwestern Hwy.) in Southfield. Exhibit hours will be 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday-Friday. The public is invited and there is no charge for admission.
