Chairman Earl Anderson warned that further tough times for education are ahead in Washington, D.C.

Anderson said after a workshop in the nation's capital that the Reagan administration is planning a 20 percent cut in U.S. Department of Education finding.

cut in U.S. Department of Education funding.
"The president wants to retool the nation (to increase productivity). We don't see how he can do it without education," said the OCC board charter member for whom the automotive lab on the Autom Hills campus is named. Anderson, the board's most outspeaken member on the need for vocational-technical training, said community colleges should play a major role in the drive to increase productivity.
