What motivated the State Boundary Commission in its two recent decisions involving Farmington Township and what is behind the separate moves of parties appealing those decisions?

The Boundary Commission jected Robert McConnell's The Bonnoary Community rejected Robert McConnell's Oct. 13 petition for an incorporation election to join Farmington Township, Wood Creek Farms and Quakertown into a home-rule city.

Commissioners said there is

a real difference between in-acroporation and consolidation and the township and two vil-lages could only be joined through consolidation.

NOW THERE ARE two law-suits, each seeking a different procedure to obtain cityhood. McConnell would like a consol-dation election. Joseph T. Brennan, representing Far-ment, wants an incorporation election.

Government officers and employes can run for the charter commission and do not bave to resign if elected;

The Boundary Commission, when petitioned, has criteria as well as administrative authority and may totally accept, totally reject the request or alter the boundaries.

Under incorporation, the state sets a public hearing on the question and commissions a study at its own expense.

AN INCORPORATION elec tion may be easier to obtain a favorable vote but the consoli-dation vote provides more protection for each unit in-volved - mainly the villages.

This is the crux of the difference, plus the different limits of authority placed upon the Boundary Commission.

Shaw noted changes have been attempted from the pre-sent plan for three consecutive years. The present law allows from \$3,500 to \$4,500 property

from 35,500 to \$45,500 property tax exemption depending on circumstances. Income limitations also vary, ranging up to \$7,500 per year, and the SEV of property allowed is \$10,000.
