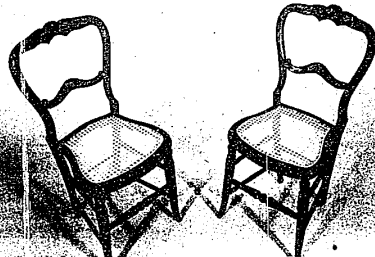

with the seals of their offices in the background. Israel I. Bick, the society's executive director, said the covers are significant to collectors and non-collectors alike. "They are mementos of one of the most important elections in the history of our nation," he said.
