

Rice hot from line in district victory

Birmingham Brother Rice was sharp at the free-throw line last Tuesday and opened state tournament play on a successful note with a 48-32 victory over Bloomfield Hills Lahser in the Birmingham Groves district.

Bother Rice, the Catholic League champion, has an 18-3 record this season. Coach Bill Norton's Rice club was at its season best at the free throw line, making good on 12 of 14 chances. Lahser made 15 field goals — just three less than Rice — but the losers were two of six from the line.

John Shasky and Paul Jokisch scored 16 and 12 points, respectively for Rice, which broke open a two-point halftime game by outscoring Lahser, 11-6, in the third quarter.

Shasky also pulled down 10 rebounds to help Rice control the boards, 22-13. Jokisch came up with seven steals, and

teammate Les Daggs dealt off five assists. Rice made 18 of 48 field goal attempts, and Lahser hit on 15 of 27 from the floor.

Tim Haynes scored 12 points and Phil Perkins added eight for Lahser, which finished with a 6-14 record under coach Nick Conti.

By winning, Rice earned a shot at the district championship against either Birmingham Groves or West Bloomfield. The district final is set for 7 p.m. Friday.

COUNTRY DAY '76 ST. AGATHA 61

The big news isn't the Yellow Jackets (15-9) complete domination over the Redford squad Tuesday night in Class C district action at Detroit Lutheran West.

The real story comes at 8:30 p.m. to-night when Country Day tangles with Orchard Lake St. Mary's in semifinal play in Detroit.

"None of the other five teams had our depth," said Farmington coach Jack Merritt. "We scored people in every event, and sometimes we had two or three people in the top six."

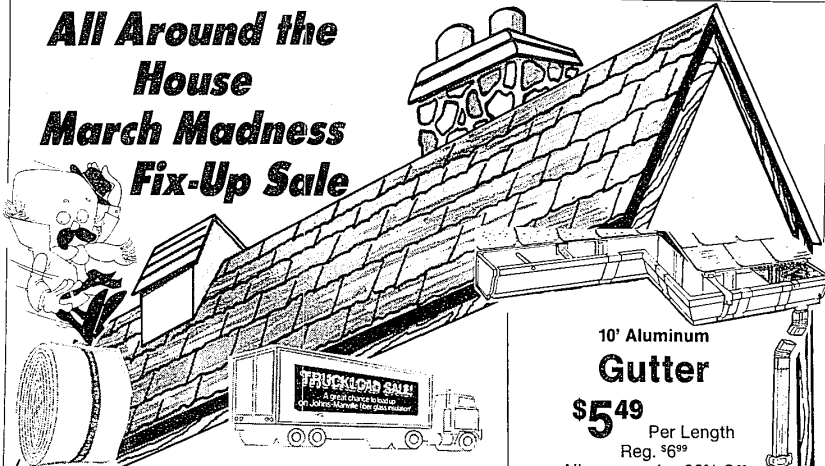
Farmington's John Uzelac finished

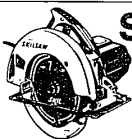
