

Lauded for duty

Grote to leave Schoolcraft

President C. Nelson Grote will leave Schoolcraft College to become president of a larger community college district in the state of Washington. Grote reports Aug. 1 to district 17, which operates two campuses in Spokane. He has headed Schoolcraft since July 1971.

The Schoolcraft board of trustees was expected to give routine approval Wednesday to his request to be released from his contract. Board Chairman Harry G. Greenleaf said: "He has done an exceptional job as president here the last 10 years. While we will hate losing him, we will never stand in the way of Dr. Grote's accepting the opportunity and challenge he has been extended in Washington."

THE WASHINGTON community college district covers six counties with a population of 500,000 and is the largest of 22 such districts in the state.

Enrollment is 47,000, about triple Schoolcraft's. Grote will have two campus presidents reporting to him. Both campuses are in Spokane. One is liberal arts oriented, the other vocational-technical. There is reportedly a certain rivalry between them which will present Grote a diplomatic challenge.

The district was organized in 1963, about the same time Schoolcraft was organized.

Grote and his wife Wilma are looking forward to being close to their first grandchild. Their daughter Carol and

her husband live in Washington. Another daughter is married and lives in Texas.

The Grote's son Mark is a junior at Livonia Stevenson High School and is an accomplished cellist.

GROTE, 53, came to Schoolcraft, serving northwestern Wayne County, after serving as dean of applied sciences and technology at Morehead (Ky.) State University.

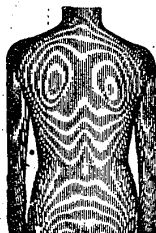
Among Michigan legislators, he is
