MOST DISCUSSION cen-tered on a parcel on the west side of Farmington Rd. be-tween Eight and Nine Mile. Township Attorney Joseph T. Brennan said the township planning commission requested the change from light industry to residential "to forestall any push for additional industrial" along Farmington Rd.

Trustee Tom Nolan, also a member of the planning commission, said the area is not industrial property and not properly residential.

"If they were to come in with a logical request for off-ice or something, then we'd consider it," Nolan said.

"What we don't want is fur-ther industrial," he added, "but where we go from that I don't know."

ALSO CHANGED were two lots near the intersection of Nine Mile and Tuck Rds. The land was also changed from light industrial to residential. Brennan said the lots are surrounded by business and residential property.

"At least our map would be consistent" if the change were made, Brennan said.


