in the Constitution provision or a shift in the financing of public education away from heavy reliance on property tax.

Fraction of the total millage levied against property in Farmington Township shows: 37.28 mills for schools (73.15%; 8.53 mills for county taxes (10.776%); and 4.73 mills (8.25%) for the township. Another 6.34% is divided between Oakland County Community College and Oakland County Intermediate, School District for special and ovcational education programs.

The township's millage rate includes 1.51 mills for the Farmington District Library: 2.01 mills for police and fire protection voted by the people: and 1.21 mills for operation.


