

Barretts To Guide Study Tour

FARMINGTON John and Carla Barrett, English teachers at Farmington and North Farmington High Schools, will accompany students to Holland, England, France and Italy this summer with the Foreign Study League of Salt Lake City, Utah.

The six-week study tour will depart by jet from New York on June 23. Students will study in Rome, Paris, Nice, Amsterdam and London.

The course is intended to introduce the student to the cultural heritage of Western Europe and to help the student

become familiar with and appreciate the great cultural treasures of the western world. Stress will be put upon culture as a living experience, and the educational experience will include instructional visits to museums, monuments, musical performances, and stage plays. The class work includes art and music history and appreciation.

The curriculum is comparative cultures with four hours of class work in the morning and excursions and course related activities in the afternoon.

The Foreign Study League all-inclusive tuition includes round-trip transportation, lodging at selected student accommodations, three meals a day, excursions and sightseeing, inter-European travel, textbooks and insurance.

In the constitution provision or a shift in the financing of public education away from heavy reliance on property taxes.

A breakdown of the total millage levied against property in Farmington Township shows: 37.83 mills for schools (73.16%); 6.83 mills for county taxes (10.71%); and 4.73 mills (9.39%) for the township. Another 6.84% is divided between Oakland County Community College and Oakland County Intermediate School District for special and vocational education programs.

The township's millage rate includes 1.51 mills for the Farmington District Library; 2.01 mills for police and fire protection voted by the people; and 1.21 mills for operation.

Farmington Performers Take Medal At Festival

Farmington High and North Farmington High schools instrumental music won a total of 65 medals in recent competition.

MEMBERS OF THE Farmington High School orchestra and bands brought home a record total of 50 medals in 26 events from the district solo and ensemble festival held Feb. 14 in Clawson High School.

Medals are awarded by the Michigan School Band and Orchestra Association for second division (very good) and first division (excellent) rated performances.

Solos and ensembles awarded first division ratings are eligible to participate in the state-wide festivals held at three locations in southern Michigan. Students will perform at the Waterford-Kettering High School in Drayton Plains on Saturday, March 21.

The judge gives an evaluation in the form of a grade and written comments on the elements of performance demonstrated. From a composite of the grades and comments, a rating is assigned of one (excellent) through five (unsatisfactory).

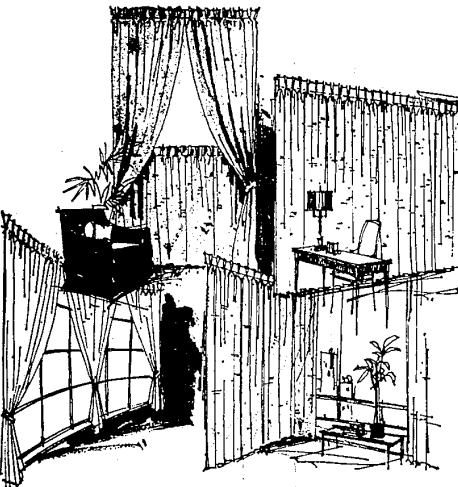
