Humanist forum to present newsman Daniel Schorr

Daniel Schorr, one of America's most-recognized names in broadcast and print journalism, will make a public presentation entitled "The Media in a Democracy" on Monday, April 20, at 30 p.m. at the Birmingham Temple of Farmington Hills. Schorr, who recently was named senior correspondent of the new 24-hour Cable News Network owned by Ted Turner, will make his appearance aprict of the furmanist Forum series presented by the Birmingham Temple. Schorr's recent move to the Cable News Network is the latest highlight in his long and flustrious career in Journalism. For 25 years he was a national

and foreign correspondent for CBS news, a position from which he re-signed in 1976 after an historic con-

signed in 1976 after an historic con-frontation with Congress.

At that time Schorr risked a jail sen-tence for refusing to disclose to the House Ethics Committee his source for a report on CIA and FBI scandals. The house had attempted to suppress the report.

AFTER LEAVING CBS, Schorr be-came a regents professor of the Uni-versity of California at Berkley, wrote a syndicated newspaper column, broad-cast commentaries for National Public Radio and recently became the first

Schor is perhaps best remembered for his involvement in the Watergate. and CIA investigations during the Nixon and Ford administrations. His name was among the top 20 names on President Nixon's enemies list, a fact the learned as he read the list for the first time while broadcasting a live TV report.
