## Antique fashion comes to the center for show

Twenty teens from Our Lady of Mercy High School will be modeling antique fashions from Helen Kopka's comprehensive collection of period costumes.

The parade of antique fashions will be staged as a benefit for Farmington Community Center beginning at 1 p.m. Wednesday, May 6, in the center on Farmington Road north of 10 Mile Road.

Mrs. Kopka has been honored in recent years as a Detroit Woman of the Year and has served in the past as promotional director of Goodwill Industries of Detroit. She is a Royal Oak resident and is expected to attend the fashion showing.

"It is doubtful that this authentic, carefully-assembled collection will ever be viewed again in its entirety," said Lois Bro, commentator for the event. "Mrs. Kopka has plans to offer it for sale."

The teen models, assembled this week in Mrs. Bro's Farmington Hills home for a try-on session, were overwhelmed with the feathers and rhinestone, the gold thread embroidery, velvet and lace they will be showing off next week, she said.

All of them are sewing students and most commented with the quality of the workmanship of the fashions.

figure; a requisite for wearing the, tiny-waisted apparel.

MRS. BRO will be lending her expertise to the show as an area authority on period costume design.

For 15 years Mrs. Bro operated Book Fair, a Royal Oak bookstore. On the second floor of Book Fair, about 1,000 dolls were housed in the Antique Doll Museum.

"My interest in dolls led to extensive study of antique fashions," she said. Some of the knowledge she gained on the subject has been told in past Farmington Community Center lectures and demonstrations where she told about dressing old or new dolls in period costumes.

Of the show she's preparing for now she says, "The oldest dress to be modeled is from the 1880's. So the era from the Gibson Girl to Joan Crawford will be represented."

All of the clothes are what those of yesterday would have termed "Sunday-go-to-meeting" clothes.

"They would have to be good clothes; clothes that were only worn for special occasions or they wouldn't have lasted this long," she said.

Antique Fashion Show guests will view a fashionable walking suit from the 1890's, a glamorous pignoir of the 1920's, and a peach chiffon number reminiscent of Joan Crawford in the 1930's.

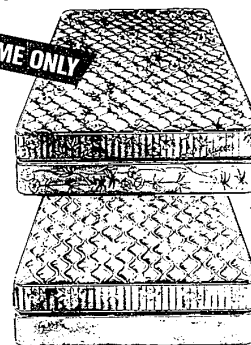
