

**CITY OF FARMINGTON  
COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS  
(Summary)**

A Regular Meeting of the Farmington City Council was held Monday, April 20, 1981 in the Council Chambers, 2800 Liberty Street, Farmington, Michigan.

**PRESENT:** Mayor Hartsock, Councilmen Bennett, Tupper, Yoder.

**ABSENT:** Councilman Mitchell.

**CITY OFFICIALS PRESENT:** City Mgr. Deadman, Dir. Seifert, Atty. Kelly and Clerk Viane.

The minutes of previous meetings were approved.

The minutes of other boards were received and/or filed.

Mr. John S. White appeared as a violation notice received from the Building Department for not having a hard-surface parking lot at 31565 Grand River. Council granted a six-month extension period.

Mr. Gary Dawley, 23361 Hickett, requested a variance to the city fence ordinance. Council will notify his immediate neighbors that a decision on the request will be made on May 4, 1981.

A permit was granted the South Farmington Baseball, Inc. for an Opening Day Game Saturday, May 9, 1981.

A resolution from the City of Berkeley requesting support of HB 4023 was received and filed.

A variance was granted to Mr. C.G. Kornfehl, President of the E.C.Kornfehl Co. to allow blasting within the city as a method used for bridge removal on Shawnee Street.

A resolution was adopted recommending approval of the transfer of ownership of 1980 Class "C" licensed business with Dance Perrier, located at 23561-21 Farmington Road, from Donald A. Boyce and Eugene F. McGee to the R.S.B.Corporation. Council reviewed plans for the proposed heating system modifications for the Municipal Building. City Manager Deadman advised that bids would be taken on the project at 2:00 p.m. April 28, 1981.

Council ratified the tentative 3-Year Work Agreement with the Public Safety Department.

Council voted unanimously to oppose Senate Bill 182.

Council reviewed the impending legislation for the Governor's Tax Relief Proposition which will be placed on the ballot for May 19, 1981.

City Manager Deadman submitted the proposed budget for FY 1981-82 to Council members for review. A series of Study Sessions was established.
