The musical "I Do I Do" by Tom Jones and Harvey Schmidt is being presented through May 17 at the Black Sheep Repertory Theatre of Manchester.


"I Do I Do" is the story of a marriage, with the audience watching the couple sing, dance, cajole and argue their way through the births of their children, money problems, love and old age.


