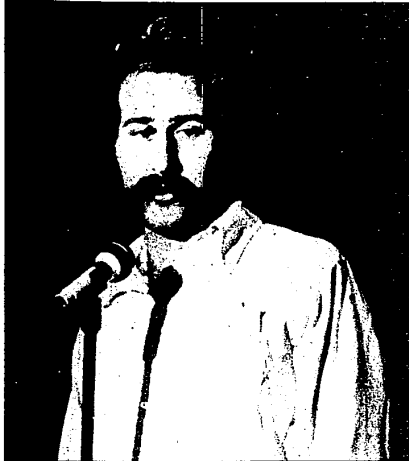
Mary Ball, executive director of the institute, said, "For more than 60 years, the International Institute has been the representative and advocate for the ethnic populations of the tri-county area."
