Budget Rule: By a vote of 328-76, the House adopted the parlia-mentary rule under which it will debate and vote on the fiscal 1932 budget resolution sent to the floor by the Democratic-controlled House Budget Committee. It is a closed rule allowing only four amendments — one is support of more defense spending, two lib-eral plans for increased social spending, and the so-called Gramm-Latta amendment, which is essentially the Reagan administra-tion's budget.

Latta amendment, which is essentially the reegan automussion tion's budget. Most members voting "yea" supported the closed rule and want-ed to get on with debate. Most members voting "nay" were liberal or moderate Demo-crats who favored an open rule under which they could attack the administration budget cuts one by one. Reps. David Bonior, D.Mount Clemens; William Brodhead, D. Detroit, James Blanchard, D.Pleasant Ridge, and William Broom-field. R.Birmingham, voted "yea."
