Threats about the dangers of LSD have as much effect on youth as the cancer scare does on smokers. Educa-tion may reduce the number of smokers or drug users, but will not be a cure-all for either.

ANY ADDITION to the school curriculum on drug abuse will be a valuable tool in the fight to elim-inate harmful drug traffic. But it is not the final answer because we adults

The Drig Rap Line is a good approach because it involves the young persons themselves, trying to help each other.
