

OCC course for Rockies

Hike in the Grand Tetons. Go white-water rafting down the Snake River.

Prowl through Craters-of-the-Moon and Glacier National Parks.

And learn geology at Oakland Community College while you're at it.

That's the offer from the science department of OCC's Auburn Hills Campus for those who have as much to see as the Rocky Mountains in July.

Entrance fees and camping permits are waived for geology students, but you will need your own camping equipment, food and transportation.

Here's the course lineup:

- Geology CSC 240.4, July 6-17, mountain climbing and rafting in an exploration of Yellowstone and Grand Teton national parks.
- Geology CSC 240.2, July 19-24, Craters-of-the-Moon and Glacier National Parks.
- Geology CSC 240.1, July 27-31, Canadian Rockies, Jasper and Banff parks.

In conjunction with each course, Hiking PER 157 will be offered.

Mail-in registrations are being taken through May 29. Regular summer registrations will be accepted July 1-2 according to alphabetical schedule.

launches, under a bill being pushed in the legislature by state Sen. Donald Bishop, R-Rochester.

Bishop's Senate Bill 8 was reported out of the environmental affairs committee with recommendation for senate passage.

The bill would provide local public hearings for both the improvement of existing public access lake sites and the determination of new sites and set procedures for DNR in establishing access sites.

It's the latest chapter in Bishop's long battle to halt new public access sites, a move favored by lakeshore property owners and geared to give them maximum political leverage.

Bishop explains it differently: "I would think residents' knowledge of the area, the traffic, the roads and the lake would be considered useful to the DNR in making its determination about where to locate public access sites."

HURON-CLINTON Metroparks have several nature center programs coming up.

Stony Creek Metropark east of Rochester offers "A Different View of Michigan History" at 7:30 p.m. Friday, May 15. Naturalist Bill Thomas will lead a nature walk to help you learn what brought the early explorers here and what life was like for the Indians. could you survive?

You have been lost in a remote mountainous area for a couple of days. You realize that it may take another day or so before rescue units can locate you.

There is enough equipment to protect you from the warm days through the rather cool evenings. Water is available from a small stream, so you go about setting up some primitive traps and snares.

When you check these in the early evening, you find a ground squirrel in one of your snares. Apparently it has just died, since the body is still warm. You know that all animals may have ticks and fleas, and in this particular area the fleas have been known to carry plague bacteria.

Food preparation key to survival

Which of the following would be your best course of action?

- Hang the animal from a tree branch for a couple of hours before dressing.
- Press the animal as quickly as possible.
- Remove the viscera but do not skin the animal immediately.
- Take no precautions since cooking will make the meat safe to eat.

The correct response is a, hang the animal from a tree. Your main concern is to prevent flea bites, and these creatures will remain on an animal only as long as the body is warm. Thorough cooking will make the meat safe to eat, but keeping away from the fleas should be your first priority.
