Beynon studies business in France

Jan Beynon, a junior from Farmington, is among 10 Alma College students spending May in Paris, France, as students in an international business seminar offered by Alma.

The students are taking a four-week seminar on multinational business administration. The seminar involves studying international companies as well as the French language.

"The students are examining three business organizations a week," said Earl Hayward, professor of French and director of Alma's program of studies in France. The students' daily schedule is very tight, according to Hayward. They study French for two hours each morning, spend two hours visiting the particular company they are examining that day, then meet in their seminar for another two hours.

Total Petroleum, Inc., and Merrill Lynch are among the international

businesses that Alma students are visiting in Paris.

Most of the students are staying in a small hotel, called a pension, which provides their breakfast and dinner. Other students are staying in private homes.

The business students arrived in Paris on May Day, a time for parades and festivities. The next day, May 2, the students began the studies which will last until the end of this month.

Although the course work ends May 28 and their professor will be returning in early June, several of the students have elected to stay in Europe longer. Miss Beynon will return June 25.

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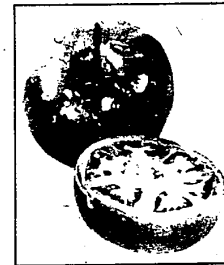
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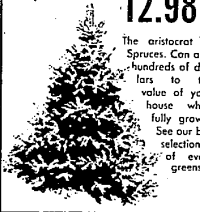
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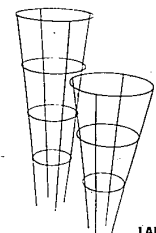
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
