O & E sponsors racquet-smackers clinic

Registration is underway for the Summer Racquet-Smackers School sponsored by The Observer & Eccentric Newspapers and the Beverly Hills Racquet & Health Club.

The five-lesson sessions provide the racquetball or tennis player with five hours of concentrated professional instruction at \$3 per hour and free summer membership in the Beverly Hills Club.

Fee for the school is \$15.

Each of the sessions offered consists of five one-hour lessons in tennis or racquetball, Monday through Friday.

The five sessions available are:

- June 15-19, 12-1 p.m. for beginners.
- June 22-26, 1-2 p.m. for advanced beginners.
- June 29-July 3, 2-3 p.m. for intermediates.

• July 6-10, 4-5 p.m. for beginners.

• July 13-17, 5-6 p.m. for advanced beginners; 6-7 p.m. for intermediates; 7-8 p.m. for beginners; and 8-9 p.m. for advanced beginners.

The school also includes a 50-percent discount on court time purchased during weekly lesson series, use of club facilities, locker, towels, showers, sauna and whirlpool, and a racquet if you don't already own one.

There is a five-students-per-instructor minimum, and participants must be 16 years or older.

I-696 FREEWAY FROM LAHSER ROAD TO I-75

PUBLIC MEETINGS

The Michigan Department of Transportation has requested and received location/design approval from the Federal Highway Administration, U.S. Department of Transportation for the construction of the I-696 Freeway from I-75 near I-75, Oakland County. This request is based on the final environmental impact statement which was approved January 18, 1981. The approved alignment begins at Lahser near 11 Mile and proceeds easterly along 11 Mile to just east of Southfield where it swings south, crosses 10th Mile, then swings easterly crossing Greenfield approximately one mile north of 10 Mile, then continues easterly to Church Street. From Church Street the alignment swings southerly to join 10 Mile at approximately Cloverlane, then proceeds easterly along 10 Mile to connect with the existing I-696 Freeway at I-75.

The Department will be holding public meetings from 2:00 to 4:00 p.m. and 7:00 to 8:00 p.m. on Wednesday, June 3 and Thursday, June 4, 1981, to discuss the portion of the approved alignment between Church Street and I-75. Meetings to discuss the segment west of Church Street will be scheduled at a later date. The purpose of the meetings will be to provide area citizens the opportunity to view the plans and discuss right of way acquisition procedures for the construction of the I-696 Freeway. The meeting scheduled for June 3 will be held in Community Center Building Hall A, 14100 Oak Park Boulevard, City of Oak Park. This meeting will be primarily to discuss the segment of the freeway within the cities of Oak Park and Huntington Woods, as well as Royal Oak Township. The meeting June 4 will be primarily to discuss the portion of the freeway within the cities of Pleasant Ridge and Royal Oak. This meeting will be held in the Pleasant Ridge Community Center Building, 4 Ridge Road.

Because no formal presentation will be given at these meetings, please feel free to stop in at any time between 2:00 and 4:00 p.m. or between 7:00 and 8:00 p.m.

Preliminary interviews, leading to the purchase of right of way for this project will begin at these meetings. Department representatives will be present to discuss the relocation services and payments that will be available to all relocatees. Relocation assistance for displaced occupants is based on occupancy of the home at the time of purchase negotiations. Moving costs, funds to purchase housing, rental payments, and other benefits will be made available to eligible occupants whether they own or rent the housing to be purchased for the right of way.

The appraisal process is scheduled to begin June 3, 1981, with acquisition to start by October 1, 1981.

A copy of the request and approval, as well as other related material including the approved Final Environmental Impact Statement will be available for review at the meetings.
