

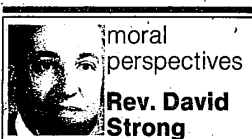
# People need to stretch vision of world

Following the attempt on the life of Pope John Paul II, the television networks interrupted their regular schedule to cover the event. Viewers phoned in their objections. They said that the networks should not replace scheduled programs with news that was outside of our own country.

We are still a long way from recognizing that we live in one world. But by bit we grope toward recognizing that we are tied together for better or for worse as one humankind.

In Ireland, Bobby Sands dies of a hunger strike. In Rome, Pope John II is shot. For a brief space of time individual figures claim international attention. For a time we identify with persons in another part of the world. Then all too quickly we are back to strictly local and national concerns.

WE ARE AT a stage when we cannot understand a whole culture. We cannot stretch far beyond the familiar. For a time we can grasp one human life lived for a goal and a purpose beyond our own national boundaries. Too often it takes a tragedy or a death to stretch our attention beyond our shores. Here is a challenge to religious institutions. Too

often religious people resist a larger understanding of religion and culture. Too often religious people seek to make everyone like themselves. Worship is often the most segregated experience of the week.

Religious institutions can help us to see that God is the God of all of the world. Christians among others need to remember that they are asked "to proclaim the good news to all the creation." There is a universal dimension to our religious traditions which needs to be discovered.

WE NEED TO keep before us the statements of such a person as Teilhard de Chardin who said "The Age of Nations is past. The task before us now, if we would not perish, is to build the earth." He offers us a way of understanding and grasping mankind without using the masses into an anti-heap. He holds the unifying forces in creative relationship with the personal. In Teilhard's thinking, moving toward unity does not mean an impersonal, faceless humanity.

We need such religious leaders who will stretch our vision to include the particular and the universal. We need persons who help us to see we are called to be the unifying forces in creative relationship with the personal. In Teilhard's thinking, moving toward unity does not mean an impersonal, faceless humanity.

We also need the media and technology to help us to be one-world minded. Satellite transmitters can beam a thousand stations into our homes. Newspapers can give us better follow-up with those individuals who help us to grasp that we are one people on earth. Teilhard calls this nothing less than "a new spirit for a new world."

## Problems behind riots remain, Ferency says

City problems, identified in the Kerker Report which covered the 1967 and 1968 riots in Watts, Newark and Detroit, have not gone away. Instead, they have increased, according to a Michigan State University professor of criminal justice.

The nation is now further polarized into two societies and manifests further disintegration between the one society which is "powerful, affluent, suburban and white," and the other which is "urban, poor, minority and older," said Zoltan Ferency. He believes police organizations and associations should unify their

actions to bring awareness of the growing problem to the community and for self-survival. The police alone cannot solve the nation's social problems, he said.

The affluent suburban society, he said, is telling the criminal justice system to bring peace, harmony and tranquility to the disturbed scene, to "keep it cool, don't bother us."

Instead of attempting to deal with the social problem of polarization, Ferency said, the nation is attempting to "imprison" it, with putting increasing numbers of unemployed young blacks in prison.

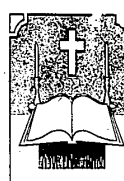
