

# To tan or not to tan

rays have been screened out of the bulbs used in a tanning salon, there are other factors involved.

"While there is no evidence at this time that UVA irradiation causes skin cancer in mice," Dr. Urbach warns, "there is a very real possibility of producing phototoxic reactions in the skin of patients who are being treated by their physicians with any of a number of widely used drugs."

Chief among these are tranquilizers, antibiotics and diuretics.

Tanners are also warned by Dr. Urbach against applying phototoxic compounds to their skin, particularly perfume ingredients containing bergamot oil, while in the sun.

MRS. LARSON has removed Dr. Urbach's framed letter from the walls of Sun Glo and all mention of his name in the newsletter published by Sun Glo but carries on what she calls "preaching until I'm blue in the face about the safety of getting a tan."

The alternate artificial rays found in

the bulbs used in Sun Glo are a spinoff of medical phototherapy, which is the treatment of skin disease with light and ultraviolet radiation, notably for psoriasis or acne.

"The bulbs were created to avoid the B and C ranges so the tan obtained is very literally safer than the sun itself," Mrs. Larson said.

"My best advertisement is my clients. Moisture is not burned out of their skin so they all look like lobsters, which they certainly would if we didn't take the precautions we do."

Precautions at Sun Glo include thorough sterilization every time a booth has been used; a physician on staff for anything that might look like it would cause a problem; and a list of the warnings for potential sun-bathers, very similar to the verbal list spelled out by Dr. Urbach.

"Any concerned salon will make sure their clients are supplied with a list of such photosensitive agents," Mrs. Larson said.

"We invite and welcome dermatologists or physicians to see what we're doing here," she said.
