

Patricia Neal opener for Livonia Town Hall

Actress Patricia Neal will headline the 1981-82 lecture series for Livonia Town Hall, which for 17 years has been bringing celebrities into the area to discuss their life and work.

On the schedule with her are columnist Shirley Eder, psychic Irene Hughes and museum director Thomas Hoving. The talks take place at 10:30 a.m. Wednesdays in the Main Kai Theater, Farmington and Plymouth roads, Livonia. After each lecture, holders of season tickets may attend a celebrity luncheon in the Mayflower Meeting House in Plymouth.

Miss Neal, as well known for her fight to overcome stroke paralysis as for her many dramatic theater and film roles, will open the series Oct. 21.

She will be followed Nov. 18 by celebrity watcher Miss Eder. Miss Hughes, who has received attention for helping police solve crimes, will speak Jan. 20. Wrapping up the series on March 17 will be Thomas Hoving, for-

mer director of the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York City. His topic will be "Art Collecting for the Big Time."

SEASON TICKETS for the four speeches cost \$20. The proceeds from the event are distributed to Livonia American Field Service chapters, which send Livonia high school students abroad and bring foreign students to Livonia for a year of study.

Reservations are made on a first-come first-served basis for celebrity luncheons. Each meal costs \$7.50.

No reservations or cancellations will be accepted after the Friday preceding the lecture. Groups of eight may request seating at the same table.

Reservations for the luncheons should be accompanied by a separate

check and mailed to Shirley Dodge, Livonia Town Hall, Box 2143, Livonia 48150.

Those wishing to be assured of luncheon seating for the entire season may buy a season luncheon ticket for \$30, and include it with the order for season tickets.

PATRICIA NEAL has won a number of awards for her film and theater roles. For her appearance in "Hud," she won the best foreign actress award from the British Academy. She has starred in such Broadway plays as "The Children's Hour," "Another Part of the Forest" and "The Miracle Worker."

Her films include "The Fountainhead" with Gary Cooper, "The Hasty Heart," "Face in the Crowd" and "The Passage." In the fall of 1979, she appeared in the TV production of "All Quiet on the Western Front."

In 1966, while making a film in Hollywood, she suffered a series of strokes caused by cerebral aneurysms. Her recovery was aided by her husband Raoul Dahl, author of many books including

"Charlie and the Chocolate Factory." He devised a system of using amateur therapists, in a program that has been adopted by 30 stroke centers in Great Britain.

Irene Hughes is a psychic and astrologer invited to appear at the National Homicide Convention in 1979 because of work with police in solving crimes, particularly murders.

She has been a subject of the TV program "That's Incredible" and writes columns for many newspapers. She has appeared on TV and radio.

Radio was also the medium used by Shirley Eder to begin communication with the world, appearing on WINS in New York while she was still in school. Later, she interviewed celebrities on WOR in New York and eventually went onto write a gossip column for several hundred American newspapers. She also appears frequently on TV.

"Art collecting is the most fascinating game there is — it's love, it's passion," said Thomas Hoving, who from 1967 was the flamboyant and innovative director of the Metropolitan Museum of Art. He transformed a debt of \$1.3 million to a surplus and is regarded as largely responsible for the King Tut art tour.
