

Symphony meets at Botsford Inn

The annual meeting of the Oakway Symphony will be held at 8 p.m. June 5 at the Coach House of Botsford Inn, Grand River north of Eight Mile Road, Farmington Hills.

Roger Welton, flutist with Oakway, and Martha Welton, harpsichordist, will provide musical entertainment during the evening. Ms. Welton will play "Les Barricades Mystérieuses" for harpsichord by Couperin.

Together they will perform the Sonata in F Major for flute and harpsichord by Jean Baptiste Loeillet. The harpsichord which will be used was made by Roger Welton in 1978. It is a copy of the one in London made by Pascal Haskins in 1760.

It is eight feet in length, with a double manual, five registrations, three sets of strings of 18 sizes. This results in an unusual variety of sounds and colors.


AFTER A SHORT business meeting, at which new board members are elected, Francisco Di Biasi, conductor, will announce the dates and soloists for the 1981-82 season. He also will speak about openings and auditions in the orchestra for the coming season.

Persons who wish to volunteer their services are being invited to attend the meeting to learn more about the orchestra and give Oakway their opinions and suggestions.

Oakway, now in its ninth season, performs more concerts than any other community orchestra in the metropolitan area. This includes six subscription concerts, a cabaret and numerous appearances with the full orchestra, such as appearances at Tel-Twelve and Twelve Oaks malls.

Various sized ensembles from the full orchestra will perform frequently throughout the season.

Cranbrook tour set for June 18

Cranbrook House and Gardens, once the estate of the George Booth family, is on the summertime agenda for The Community House in Birmingham.

A visit to Cranbrook House is scheduled for June 18 with a chartered bus leaving The Community House at 9:30 a.m.

The outing includes transportation, admission to the gardens, where a tour will be conducted by guides familiar with the plantings and history of the outdoor sculpture, a gourmet luncheon at Cranbrook House preceded by a wine punch reception and a tour of Cranbrook House following lunch.

The package is \$23.50 per person with reservations now being accepted at The Community House.

Cranbrook House was designed by world-famous Detroit-based architect Albert Kahn. It was done in the style of an English manor home to house a family who traveled widely, collected extensively, appreciated music, literature and all the arts. Wine punch will be served in the library, which has elaborately carved paneling. Oriental rugs

and fine antiques. This room alone can seat several hundred people. The library, like all of the main rooms of the mansion, has been kept just as it was when the family lived there.

The gardens, expertly maintained by volunteer members of the Cranbrook House and Gardens Auxiliary, will be in full color for the June 18 visit. From rose gardens to the manicured formal sunken gardens, the many walks and promenade areas, to herb and Japanese-style plantings, the variety is almost unrivaled in the Midwest.

"As a renewal and continuation of a certain operating millage increase previously approved by the electorate, which increase expired with the 1980 levy, shall the limitation on the amount of taxes which may be levied against all taxable real and tangible personal property in Clarenceville School District of Oakland and Wayne Counties, be increased, as provided by Section 6, Article IX of the Constitution of the State of Michigan by \$1.00 per one thousand dollars of the assessed valuation, as finally equalized, of all such property in said School District for a period of five (5) years, from 1981 to 1985, both inclusive, to be used for the purpose of paying general operating expenses of said School District?"

OPERATING MILLAGE RENEWAL

"As a renewal and continuation of a certain operating millage increase previously approved by the electorate, which increase expired with the 1980 levy, shall the limitation on the amount of taxes which may be levied against all taxable real and tangible personal property in Clarenceville School District of Oakland and Wayne Counties, be increased, as provided by Section 6, Article IX of the Constitution of the State of Michigan by \$3.00 per one thousand dollars of the assessed valuation, as finally equalized, of all such property in said School District for a period of five (5) years, from 1981 to 1985, both inclusive, to be used for the purpose of paying general operating expenses of said School District?"
