

UF names '81 Torch Drive chairman, amends by-laws

Walter McCarthy Jr. of Birmingham, president of the Detroit Edison Co., will serve as general chairman of the 1981 United Foundation Torch Drive this fall.

United Foundation President Robert E. Dewar of Bloomfield Hills announced McCarthy's appointment at the organization's annual meeting recently held in Detroit Plaza Hotel.

As the Torch Drive's top volunteer leader, McCarthy will organize and direct the 1981 campaign team.

ALSO AT the annual meeting, an amendment to UF's by-laws was ap-

proved. The amendment completes the change in structure between the United Foundation and United Community Services.

The amendment follows UF board action in March approving a transfer of functions between the two organizations.

"The change will work to the mutual benefit of the UF and our agencies," said UF Chairman of the Board Alan E. Schwartz, senior partner in the law firm of Hoenigman, Miller, Schwartz and Cohen.

"Although the former structure was both efficient and accountable, we (the

UF board) believe that contributors will be pleased to know that the organization to whom they make their contributions is directly responsible and accountable for allocating the funds they contribute," he said.

IN THE NEW structure, the UF continues its function of fundraising and consolidates its own allocating and operational planning function with those of UCS.

This makes the UF directly responsible for allocating Torch Drive funds each year to 111 charities including those budgeted previously by UCS.

United Community Services will focus its efforts on community planning for the tri-county area.

In other action, Schwartz was re-elected chairman of the board and Robert E. Dewar, chairman of the finance and executive committees for Knart Corp., was re-elected UF president.

In addition, Arthur R. Seder Jr., chairman and president of the American Natural Resources Company, was re-elected vice chairman of the board.

NEWLY ELECTED AS vice chairman of the UF board were Roger Smith of Bloomfield Hills, chairman, General

Motors Corp.; Philip Caldwell of Bloomfield Hills, chairman and chief executive officer, Ford Motor Co.; and Tom Turner, president, Metropolitan Detroit AFL-CIO Council. All three will serve one-year terms.

Elected as new vice presidents were W. Michael Blumenthal, chairman and chief executive officer, Burroughs Corp.; Gerald Greenwald, vice chairman, Chrysler Corp.; Howard H. Kehrl, vice chairman, General Motors Corp.

Also, F. James McDonald, president, General Motors Corp.; James H. McNeal Jr., president and chief executive officer, The Budd Co.; Jane Hale

Morgan, director, City of Detroit Public Library; and Donald E. Peterson, president, Ford Motor Co.

AT THE MEETING, Dewar also announced McCarthy's top volunteer campaign leadership team members.

They are: Mervyn Manning, vice president and general manager, Ford Tractor Operations, Ford Motor Co.; Mrs. Frank Gerbig of West Bloomfield; Raymond Spina, partner in charge, Deloitte, Haskins and Sells; Turner; and Jeanne Findlater, vice president and general manager of WXYZ-TV, Channel 7.

Super Bowl rail service authorized

The state transportation commission has authorized spending \$66,000 to build a rail passenger platform at the Pontiac Silverdome and to improve railroad track in the area for special trains carrying fans between downtown Detroit and the Super Bowl game next January.

Two Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority (SEMTA) trains will carry nearly 2,000 fans

from the St. Antoine Station near the Renaissance Center to the Silverdome at Pontiac via Grand Trunk Western railroad tracks.

Work will begin as soon as bids are let and a contractor chosen.

"This could be a first step toward future rail service to the Silverdome," said commission chairman Hannes Meyers Jr. of Holland, Mich.
