Asthmatic youth invited to camp

The Michigan Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatries and the Michigan Allergy Society will again sponsor Camp Michi-MAC for asthmatic children in 1981. In 1980, the program was instituted in cooperation with the Metropolita VMCA camping services. A two-week camp was run at Camp Nissokone near Oscoda. Twenty-five asthmatic children between the ages of 10-14 years participated in all camp activities, including sports, with 125 non-asthmatic children.

Allen Sosin, a pediatric allergist who has practiced in Farmington for many years, is the medical director of Cambundhich-McA. He was also elected treasurer for the Michian Allergy Society for the coming year.

Camp Michi-MACS purpose is to provide the specialized medical supervision needed to allow the asthmatic child to participate with all campers in a total camping experience and have fun.
