Campers learn about life on the farm

There are wonders and delights of country life in a natural farm setting at Upland Hills Farm Day Camp.

Group rates include round-trip transportation from the Farmington Community Center, 24705 Farmington Road, leaving at 8 a.m., returning at 5 p.m. Camp sessions for the season are June 29 to July 10, July 13-24, July 27 to Aug. 7 or Aug. 10-21.

Students may choose two-, four-, six- or eight-week sessions. Children 5-12 years old experience healthful summer play activities while gaining meaningful farm knowledge under the professional guidance of skilled educators.

The day campers participate in all aspects of farming, care and feeding of animals, gardening, haying, interspersed with hay rides, nature crafts and study, riding, swimming, boating and fishing.

The staff is under the supervision of Knight and Dorothy Webster. Both have many years of broad teaching and agricultural training experience.

Asthmatic youth invited to camp

The Michigan Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics and the Michigan Allergy Society will again sponsor Camp Michi-MAC for asthmatic children in 1981.

In 1980, the program was instituted in cooperation with the Metropolitan YMCA camping services. A two-week camp was run at Camp Nissokone near Oscoda. Twenty-five asthmatic children between the ages of 10-14 years participated in all camp activities, including sports, with 125 non-asthmatic children.

For 1981, the program has been enlarged. Fifty boys and girls (ages 10-14 years) will go to Camp Nissokone from July 25-Aug. 8.

Twenty-five asthmatic children (ages 8-10 years) will be at Camp Ohyesa near Howell for a one-week camp from Aug 2-8.

Allen Sosin, a pediatric allergist who has practiced in Farmington for many years, is the medical director of Camp Michi-MAC. He was also elected treasurer for the Michigan Allergy Society for the coming year.

Camp Michi-MAC's purpose is to provide the specialized medical supervision needed to allow the asthmatic child to participate with all campers in a total camping experience and have fun.

There is a charge of \$275 at Nissokone (which includes transportation) and \$135 at Ohyesa (no transportation available).

Partial or total camperships are available. Persons with children that require financial assistance may contact the YMCA Camping services at 313-953-1726.

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
