

Livonia-Redford Group Closes Generation Gap

There's no generation gap at the Theatre Guild of Livonia-Redford as they swing into presentation of their children's show, "Sleeping Beauty."

Enthusiastic youngsters, from the 11-year-old page boys to college graduates, with lots of teenagers in between and a sprinkling of older guild members, have cooperated to solve the problems of presenting a play in four different high schools on four Saturdays.

The show opened last Saturday in Redford Union, goes on this Saturday, March 7, in Bentley; March 14 in Thurston, and March 21 in Franklin. Performances are for 11 a.m., 1 p.m. and 3 p.m. each Saturday.

THE PROP moving problem was presented to Hamilton Aldridge Jr., who plays Prince Godwin in the play. Hamilton, a Junior at Detroit Institute of Technology, tackled the problem as set designer.

His solution is to have props that can lie flat or come apart, such as three velvet thrones for the royal family. Every Wednesday night, with the help of the whole crew, includ-

ing the 11-year-olds, these are loaded on a 12-foot trailer and transported to the next high school. Hamilton says he does this as a change of pace from school work.

With the enthusiasm of young and old in the cast, the costumes, the music and the dancing, "Sleeping Beauty" should really come alive for the children of the area. The original dances, choreographed by Charlotte Needham, are being performed by the Rose-dale School of the Dance.

CO-PRODUCERS of the show, Terry Borovik and Jean Schirmer, have an equally youthful crew working behind the scenes, including high school students who are knowledgeable about lighting, and even about stitching up golden couches for Sleeping Beauty to fall on after the fatal prick of the spinning wheel.

They almost had to put together a spinning wheel, but Terry was able to come up with one from a local merchant.

Those who arrive early for the performances will be entertained by Scamp-E, the Clown, John Dawson.

The cast includes Russ Vogel as King Henry; Mary Van Alsten as Queen Hildegarde; Cyrus Khavari as Lord Archibald; Lynn Vosgerchian as Lady Agatha; Marilyn Howell as Cook; James Monroe as the jester; Rae Lawrence as Dear-dine; Lyn Tozviak as Pearlina; Maureen Delany as Princess Gloria; Donna Casey, Janet Von Alsten, Tina Horbeck, Sandy Michael and Lynn Garvey, as ladies-in-waiting; and Janianne Lindry, the narrator. The male understudy is Brian Birkhart.

WORKING BEHIND the scenes are Ken Chomont, the director, and Rose Marie Kopeck, assistant. Linda Wroter is music director. Pat Secor is looking after costumes, with the assistance of Donna Watkins, Carole Lasco, Shirley Hulet, Pat Winter, and Jean Schirmer.

Also behind the scenes are Randy Strong and Vic Ber-man, lighting; John Dawson and Dick Bron, sound; and Elissa Ray, makeup.

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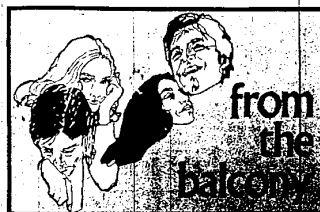
