

Warren Widening Promised In '71

Efforts of Westland city officials to get the Wayne

County Road Commission to pave and widen parts of Warren Road in 1971.
Mayor Eugene McKinney

announced Thursday that the road commission "has given tentative approval" for the Warren project following a series of meetings with Commission Managing Director James Davy.

Although the county's schedule is not finalized, it said that it will widen Warren from Venoy to Wayne Road in 1971, the mayor said.

"This will greatly alleviate traffic problems in the area and is a major step forward in our dealings with the county," the mayor said.

The widening and paving of Warren from Venoy to Middle Belt is tentatively scheduled for 1973, the mayor added.

In addition, the road commission plans to widen Cherry Hill from Inkster Road to Wayne Road in 1972.

Grandview To Hear Talks By Students

Two American Field Service students will address Clarenceville's Grandview PTA on Wednesday, March 11, in Grandview school beginning at 8 p.m.

OCC Tally: 12,167

Oakland Community College's winter enrollment was 12,167, which represents a 33% increase over last winter's enrollment of 9,152.

By area the enrollment is as follows: Auburn Hills Campus, 1,777; Highland Lakes Campus, 1,583; Orchard Ridge Campus in Farmington, 4,812; extension centers, 2,515; apprentice technical programs, 1,375.

Of the total, 10,463 are residents of the college district, 1,686 are Michigan residents who reside out of the college district and 18 are out-of-state residents.

A total of 61% of the students are enrolled in the liberal arts and science transfer programs of business administration, 1,211; education, 1,036; engineering, 286; math and science, 116; and liberal arts, 4,559.

Applied science and arts students make up approximately 17% of the enrollment. A partial listing of those courses includes: accounting, 173; automotive technology,

98; commercial art, 197; data processing, 216; dental assisting, 56; drafting, 45; electronics technology, 81; executive secretarial, 150; food service technology, 70.

Also, landscape technology, 24; law enforcement, 248; library technology, 75; mechanical design technology, 40; medical laboratory technology, 55; medical office assistant, 35; professional nursing, 394; retailing, 59 and stenography, 21.

Apprentice technical programs have a total enrollment of 428 in such courses as die maker, industrial plant electrician, machine repair, pipe fitter, tool machinist, welder and millwright.

A total of 295 students are enrolled in employee-in-training programs including computer grinder, die maker, industrial plant technician, machine repair machinist, millwright, single-purpose operator and tool maker.

GED Test At OCC Set March 13-14

The general education development test will be given by Oakland Community College on March 13-14 at OCC's community service facility (formerly St. Frederick School), 150 East Wide Track Drive, Pontiac.

The testing session begins on Friday at 6 p.m. and ends at 10 p.m. It resumes on Saturday at 9 a.m. and concludes at 4:30 p.m.

A certificate of high school equivalency will be awarded by the Michigan Department of Education to persons passing the examination.

Applicants must be a minimum of 18 years of age. Persons who are 18 must have been out of high school for at least a two-year period.

Persons under 18 are not eligible to take the examination. The testing fee is \$5.

Computer Seminars March 7

Two computer seminars, one of particular interest to high school mathematics and science teachers and another designed for accountants, will begin their first of three sessions Saturday morning, March 7, at Oakland University, Rochester.

Time sharing, an emerging method enabling schools to use computer facilities at distant locations, will be the focus of the workshop for high school teachers.

In the workshop, remote terminals coupled to telephones at the university will be used by teachers in transmitting data to a remote computer for processing and message return. Each session will begin with a lecture covering material to be utilized in the two-hour laboratory session that follows.

The potential uses of "time sharing" in the schools include curriculum improvement on an individual teacher basis and practically instantaneous compilation of data without the overwhelming expense of purchasing, maintaining and staffing individual computer centers for each school, or even district for that matter.

The introductory workshop for accountants will orient them to computer potential, structure, and hardware. The second session will cover accounting model processing and the final meeting will explore computer language.

Both seminars have been designed for teachers and accountants with either a minimum or no previous computer experience. Adults interested in attending either seminar may contact Oakland University's Division of Continuing Education, Rochester. Phone 377-2000, ext. 2171.
