# Neatness is next to godliness, too

Life's most refreshing lessons often come from the most unlikely teachers. One of my most memorable teachers was only 10 years old when he made his impression. He used a simple visual aid and probably did not know that he was teaching anything at all.

Actually the youngster was fulfilling an assignment given by his own teacher. He had been told to put on one piece of paper what he remembered most from the semester that was drawing to a close.

Instead of paper he chose cardboard, on which he pasted a small mirror. Under the mirror he printed in a bold purple crayon, as only youngsters can: "This is a neat person. God loves him."

We have all looked into mirrors and have seen a variety of things. We have noticed that the mustache is crooked or that the eye shadow is smudged. Perhaps the sight of a new wrinkle or a budding pimple has bothered our pride. It may be that we have seen little more than the toothpaste which has been splashed on the glass.

But have we ever really seen what we considered to be a neat person?

**SOMEHOW** the very idea of admiring our image in the mirror comes across as a bit bi-

zarre if not terribly conceited. Perhaps we have looked into the glass on the wall and admired a new hairstyle or a renewed tan, but such perceptions are seldom more than skin deep.

And if this exercise in self-esteem happened to be in a public place, we probably covered our embarrassment by switching to some less attention-getting activity if someone came along.

Whether we enjoy looking in the mirror is, of course, not the issue. But the image we have of ourselves is very much an issue.

As a matter of fact, our preoccupation with the many surface things of life on which cosmetic companies make their money is an indication of our need to feel worthwhile. Such a focus also provides a distraction from look-

ing deeper than our skin to discover the kind of beauty seen by the boy with the purple crayon.

When we can come to a realization of our own worth and believe it down to our toes, the cosmetic business may have to find a new pitch. When we can look into the mirror and see the beauty beneath the blemish no one will have to convince us to do worthwhile things, to relax, to enjoy life or to reach out to others in their need, because all of that will follow.

**ONLY THOSE** who doubt their own loveliness have a need to be conceited. Big heads are often the result of small or wounded hearts. Those who have sense of their own worth have no need to be conceited and are quite inclined to enhance the lives of those they touch.

It has been a few years since that boy pasted his mirror on the cardboard, and I have lost track of him, but I do hope that no one has tried to change his perspective.

With the message of his purple crayon, we can afford to look into the mirror and not go bananas over a threatening pimple or an unwanted wrinkle. We will know that it is only on the wrapper of a person whose beauty is far more than skin deep.
