"I still can't see how she got there," said Eleanor Parpolowicz, Mrs. Lalik's daughter after the ordeal. The elderly woman has trouble getting around without her walker. She broke her hip four years ago.

"She just wanted to sleep in the woods, 'Mrs. Parpolowicz said.

"She used to walk in the woods years ago," said Bob Parpolowicz, Mrs. Lalik's grandson. 'But she's done nothing like that in the last 10 years.

MRS. LALIK'S ORDEAL began at 9 pm. June 13. Her family had been away for 34 hours before returning to

find their grandmother missing.
Livonia police were called.
"At night, it's just pitch black," said officer James Witch, was go to the woods. A fire department rescrient was also on the scene.
Mrs. Lalik, who only speaks Polish, was treated for exposure to the damp, rainy weather and insect bites.
Work said Max the dog and Bennett probably saved Mrs. Lalik's life. Citing the woman's age and health, Work said she may have not been able to survive the night.
Mrs. Lalik came to the United States learly 70 years ago. She has lived h Livonia with her family since 1950.
