Fares for the Southeast Michigan Transportation Authority (SEMTA) commuters will rise July 1. Base bus fares will go from 60 cents to 75 cents. Rail fares will rise from \$1 to 15.15. Zone charges re-main unchanged. Park-and-ride lim-ited contine force will rise from \$0.10 main unchanged. Park-and-ride lim-ited service fares will rise from 80 to 95 cents. Small bus essential trans-portation services, like WAYCART and OCART, rise from \$1.20 to \$1.50. Dial-a-ride base fares go from 60 cents to 90 cents.
