# New look under way at OCC

The Orchard Ridge Campus of Oakland Community College will get an improved look during the summer mooths. Afmajor parking lot paving and a restoration of the campus plaza in Farmington Hills were contracted out by the board of trustees last week. Ajax Paving Industries Inc. of Brighton was low bidder at \$146,785 for paving portions of the campus parking lot which are deeply rutted and unimproved since their original sealcoating job.

Sooren H. Gormanian, director of physical facilities, said the work will be done

cal facilities, said the work will be done aisle by aisle so that the lot need not be

closed. He added that three aisles used by the SEMTA Park & Ride program were paved at the transportation authority's ex-pense.

Heineman & Lovett Co. of Detroit was awarded a \$69,680 contract to restore the plaza with a new concrete surface, new insulation and new waterproofing.

Gozmanian said the price was excellent because there is intense competition among contractors for scarce work.

FOR OTHER campuses the board:

• Ordered a \$57,500 addition and modification of old barracks on the Auburn

Hills campus to be used as a central stores facility serving all four campuses and the central administrative headquarters. Anthony Jarson, controller, said it will easile the college to have more efficient operations and more standardized purchasing. To be ordered for the facility are a \$14,000 Hillo tractor and additional shelving for \$8,000.
