Don't install a fan in an attic gable Don't install a tan in an attic gable vent to cool the house. Attics have many cracks and places for air to leak through. The fan will pull air through these cracks and will do a poor job of ventilating the house.

at least one square foot open area for each 1,000 CFM fan capacity. If open-ings is covered with:




