"We want it (foster home regula-tions) under local ordinances so we (the township) can have control," said town-ship Clerk Betty Sue Dupree.

TOWNSHIP OFFICIALS, during the licensing process for the other five foster care homes in the township, have resented the state mandating where homes should be located. The township, hey point out, is not even authorized to make health or safety inspections. Supervisor John Doherty believes the township could better control such facilities by creating a special use dis-

cilities by creating a special use dis-trict, such as is being adopted for sen-

trict, such as is being adopted for sen-ior citizen housing.

"These places (foster care homes) are run by IB-year-olds with only two or three weeks training. They're just out for a buck," he charges.
"Let's treat them (retarded) right. It's OK to create small groups, but they

should be in an area where they have space, like cluuters. Safety, adequate care and nearly medical attention are needed, said Doberty.

"I'm no physchologist, but I know people's cares and concerns. We're recognizing, for example, senior citizens need special care," he added.

DOHERTY SAID neighbors plain about the occupants of all the township's foster care homes except the Green Lake House at 3450 Green Lake Road.

The other facilities are Freedom Adult Foster Homes, 2722 Littletell;

Excellence for Developmentally Disabled, 2451 Chata Street, North Pine Home, 2344 N. Pine Center, and Dawn Rouse, 4112 Dawn Lake.
